- I. **Call to Order:** The Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Upper Moreland Township was called to order via audio conference call by the President of the Board of Commissioners, Kevin C. Spearing at 7:00 p.m.
- II. **Moment of Silent Meditation/Pledge of Allegiance**
- III. **Roll Call:** Commissioner and Board President Spearing, Commissioner and Vice President Whiting; Commissioners Scull, Lavallo, McFatrige, Valenza and Lockard. Also present: Matthew H. Candland, Township Manager, and Sean Kilkenny, Township Solicitor.
- IV. **Presentations/Announcements:**
  - A. Commissioner Spearing announced that prior to tonight's meeting the Board of Commissioners held an Executive Session via audio/video/conference call to discuss legal and personnel matters. The Board of Commissioners will meet again in an Executive Session at the adjournment of tonight's meeting to continue discussions on legal and personnel matters.

#### **PUBLIC HEARING #1954 – 7:00 P.M.**

- Commissioner Valenza motioned, seconded by Commissioner McFatrige and the Board of Commissioners approved by a vote of 7-0, to open PUBLIC HEARING #1954 to receive public comments pursuant to Article III, Section 302, of the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code, to consider adoption of the Upper Moreland Township 2040 Comprehensive Plan.
- PUBLIC HEARING #1953 was held.
- Commissioner Valenza motioned, seconded by Commissioner McFatrige and the Board of Commissioners approved by a vote of 7-0, to close PUBLIC HEARING #1954.

5. **New Business:**
- a. **Motion to approve** the ICMA Administrative Services Agreement, implementing new pricing.
    - Commissioner Valenza made a motion, seconded by Commissioner McFatrige and the Board of Commissioners approved by a vote of 7-0, the ICMA Administrative Services Agreement, implementing new pricing.

- Commissioner Valenza inquired about the Pennsylvania Turnpike Survey and Mr. Candland replied that two virtual open houses are schedule for July 8, 2020 at 2 p.m. and July 9, 2020 at 7 p.m. Commissioner Spearing stated that the Township has recommended that the Study includes the entire Turnpike corridor, not be limited to Blair Mill Road/Route 63 and Turnpike, and that the Willow Grove Interchange be the first priority in the Study.
- Commissioner Valenza stated that Pennsylvania State Association for Township Commissioners (PSATC) will meet on July 8, 2020 to discuss moving control of fireworks from the State level to the local townships' level. Commissioner Spearing stated that fireworks are not legal in R2 or R3 districts.
- Commissioner Whiting commented that fireworks are readily available for sale at many convenient stores.
- Commissioner Scull stated that residents can contact Senator Maria Collett to show their support.
  - The Commissioners directed Mr. Candland to send a letter of support to the State to move control of fireworks from the State level to the local townships' level, and a discussion will continue at the next Public Health & Safety Committee meeting to amend the Ordinance.

    - Commissioner Lavalle amended Item "b." to read, "**Motion to approve** distribution of the Fair Oaks Park Basin design project drawings and specifications for public bid through the appropriate portal for interested contractors to access the design documents."
      - Commissioner Lavalle recommended using the PennBid portal.
    - Commissioner Lavalle motioned, seconded by Commissioner McFatrige and the Board of Commissioners approved by a vote of 7-0, distribution of the Fair Oaks Park Basin design project drawings and specifications for public bid through the appropriate portal for interested contractors to access the design documents.

- Commissioner Spearing stated that the Township building is open and is complying with all the recommendations of the Governor. He strongly recommends that the public adhere to the CDC guidelines.
- Commissioner Spearing asked the Committee Chairs to decide whether they will hold Committee meetings in August.
- Commissioner Whiting stated that the health and safety of the community is paramount and recommended that the community wear masks in public places and practice safety habits at home.
- Commissioner Lavalley stated that there will be a ribbon-cutting ceremony at the Korean War Memorial on Saturday, July 4, 2020 at 10 a.m. at Memorial Grove Park, 101 Stump Road, Montgomeryville, PA 18936. State and local representatives will provide public comments. The memorial has been funded by government grants and donations from South Korea.

**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF UPPER MORELAND TOWNSHIP GRANTING A SEASONAL DRIVE-IN MOVIE THEATER USE WITH CONDITIONS TO NEW CENTURY ASSOCIATES GROUP, LP FOR THE OUTDOOR DISPLAY OF MOTION PICTURES FROM MAY 1, 2020 TO NOVEMBER 15, 2020 AT THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 2000 COUNTY LINE ROAD AS A RESULT OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC.**

**WHEREAS**, New Century Associates, LP is the landowner of record of the shopping center located within the Township commonly referred to as the “Marketplace at Huntingdon Valley”, having an address of 2000 County Line Road, Huntingdon Valley, PA 19006, and more particularly identified as Montgomery County Tax Parcel No. 59-00-15925-00-9 (the “Property”); and

**WHEREAS**, an indoor movie theater known as the “Penn Cinema Huntingdon Valley” (the “Movie Theater”) is located on the Property; and

**WHEREAS**, commercial motion picture exhibitors have faced particularly severe financial hardships in 2020, first as a result of COVID-19 closure orders, and continuing to date due to federal and state imposed safety measures and general unease toward large indoor social gatherings amongst the general moviegoing audience; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 6, 2020, Governor Tom Wolf issued a Proclamation of Disaster Emergency in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania as a result of a novel coronavirus (“COVID-19”); and

**WHEREAS**, on March 17, 2020, the President of the Upper Moreland Township Board of Commissioners issued a Proclamation of Disaster Emergency pursuant to the provisions of Section 7501(b) of the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Services Code, 35 Pa. C.S. 7101, et seq.; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 18, 2020, the Governor ordered non-essential businesses in Montgomery County to close to protect employees, customers, and suppliers and limit the spread of the virus through personal contact and surfaces; and

**WHEREAS**, the Upper Moreland Township Board of Commissioners recognizes that these orders and closures have presented unprecedented financial hardship and has severely strained the resources of the Township’s businesses; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the provisions of Section 7501(d) of the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Services Code, 35 Pa. C.S. § 7501(d), the Township is authorized to exercise the powers vested in Section 7501(d) in the light of the exigencies of the emergency situation without regard to time-consuming procedures and formalities prescribed by law; and

**WHEREAS**, on May 1, 2020, the Governor's Office presented a plan entitled Process to Reopen Pennsylvania which will ease social gathering restrictions in phases based upon public health indicators while requiring ongoing compliance with Centers for Disease Control and Pennsylvania Department of Health guidance for social distancing and workplace safety; and

**WHEREAS**, federal and state health and regulatory agencies have called for the implementation of safety measures, such as increased workplace ventilation, increased physical distance between employees and customers, and alteration of hours based on building size and number of employees; and

**WHEREAS**, the safety measures are advanced and made more effective by the temporary allowance of outdoor drive-in motion picture exhibitions, provided such outdoor exhibition of motion pictures occurs consistent with all other state and federal statutes, regulations, and orders.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Commissioners of Upper Moreland Township, hereby establishes guidelines and a policy for the seasonal use of the Property for drive-in motion picture exhibitions for a period of time from May 1, 2020 to November 15, 2020, where it might otherwise be prohibited, provided the following:

1. The use of the Property for outdoor drive-in motion picture exhibition is strictly limited to a seasonal use beginning May 1, 2020 and expiring November 15, 2020.
2. The Movie Theater shall at all times comply with the Nuisance Regulations found in the Upper Moreland Township Code, particularly, Chapter 223, Section 223-3(G)'s prohibitions on the amplification of sound outdoors after 10:00 p.m. and before 7:00 a.m. prevailing time; all outdoor drive-in motion picture exhibitions must conclude by 11:00 p.m.
3. The Movie Theater shall not permit the amplification of a motion picture's sound through an exterior sound system; all sound resulting from the motion picture's exhibition must be streamed individually or to each patron's vehicle or network-enabled audio device.
4. All tickets sold for each outdoor drive-in motion picture exhibition must be conducted in advance of the screening of the motion picture.
5. Movie Theatre staff must validate ticket purchase before permitting entry and continuously monitor the outdoor drive-in area before and during motion picture screenings.
6. The existing restrooms in the movie theatre shall be available for drive-in patron use. The Movie Theater occupant load for indoor screenings and concurrent outdoor drive-in film screenings cannot exceed 541 occupants. The number of patrons permitted inside the movie theater to use the restroom facilities shall be limited to allow for proper social distancing. The Movie Theater staff shall be responsible for controlling building access.
7. Food service is permitted to be provided by the Movie Theatre snack stand and delivered primarily to patron's vehicles by staff.

8. The sale of alcoholic beverages by the Movie Theater and the possession of open containers and consumption of alcoholic beverage by outdoor drive-in patrons is expressly prohibited. The Movie Theater staff shall monitor and advise patrons of these prohibitions.

9. Trash receptors must be provided in the outdoor drive-in area by the Movie Theater.

10. Outdoor drive-in movie patrons must remain in their vehicles before and during the motion picture screening. The Movie Theater shall be responsible for determining the maximum number of patrons per vehicle permitted in the outdoor drive-in area.

11. The motion pictures to be exhibited at the outdoor drive-in shall be family-oriented and not display inappropriate behavior or nudity.

12. In order to allow for proper social distancing, the Movie Theater shall install a four and a half (4 ½) foot access aisle in between each patron's parked vehicle and there shall be a maximum of sixty-two (62) outdoor drive-in parking spaces permitted on the Property. A minimum of three (3) handicapped parking spaces must be included within the 62 total spaces. Parking spaces shall be individually numbered.

13. Control of vehicle and pedestrian traffic to the outdoor drive-in area will be limited during the exhibition of the motion pictures to ensure the safety of pedestrians. "Cut-through traffic" is expressly prohibited.

14. Ingress to the outdoor drive-in area is strictly limited to be from the center access point of the Property near the fire station. Egress from the outdoor drive-in area is permissible on both side access points on the Property.

15. No permanent physical barriers shall be erected on the Property nor in the outdoor drive-in area which would restrict the Code Enforcement Officer, the Fire Department, Police Department or Emergency Responder's access around the building.

16. A violation of any individual condition, or combination thereof by the Movie Theater, shall provide cause for the Township to immediately shutdown the drive-in area for the evening, and affords the Township the discretion to rescind this Resolution and the permissions granted herein.

**WHEREAS**, Joanne L. Hartshorne (“Applicant”), submitted a plan entitled “Plan of Minor Subdivision” for Tax Map Parcel Nos 59-00-01111-00-9 consisting of one (1) sheet, prepared by Protract Engineering, Inc., dated January 28, 2020, (the “Plan”), attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and incorporated by reference.

**WHEREAS**, the Plan proposes a minor subdivision of the parcel of land owned by Joanne L. Hartshorne located at 4121 Blair Mill Road, Hatboro, PA 19040 within the Upper Moreland Township R-3 Residential Zoning District identified as Tax Map Parcel No. 59-00-01111-00-9 (the “Property”); and

**WHEREAS**, the Property is currently comprised of approximately 0.5923 acres and contains an existing single-family dwelling with associated driveway accessing Home Road and is improved with a shed located in the rear yard and;

**WHEREAS**, the Plan proposes to subdivide approximately 10,948 square-feet of the Property to create one additional building lot which would be located at the corner of Blair Mill Road and Home Road, and by which all existing features are to remain and no new construction, grading or earth disturbance is proposed; and

**WHEREAS**, Gilmore & Associates, Inc., the Township’s Engineer, reviewed the Plan, and issued a Letter of Review dated April 1, 2020, attached hereto as **Exhibit B** and incorporated by reference, recommending Applicant request various waivers from the Township’s Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance; and

**WHEREAS**, McCloskey & Faber, P.C., the Township’s Landscape Architect, reviewed the Plan, and issued a Letter of Review dated March 9, 2020, attached hereto as **Exhibit C** and incorporated by reference, finding impact on landscape requirements relative to street trees located on the Property and sited in the ultimate right-of-way and recommending Applicant request waivers from the Township’s Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance; and

**WHEREAS**, the Montgomery County Planning Commission reviewed the Plan, and issued a Letter of Review dated February 27, 2020, attached hereto as **Exhibit D**, generally supporting Applicant’s proposal stating that the Plan is generally consistent with the County’s comprehensive plan and recommending that the Applicant install sidewalk along the Home Road portion of the Property to connect a pedestrian path located approximately 350 feet from the Property that leads to the Blair Mill Elementary School; and further recommended installation of

a marked crosswalk along at the intersection of Blair Mill and Home Road to facilitate pedestrian access; and

**WHEREAS**, McMahon Associates, Inc., the Township’s Traffic Engineer reviewed the Plan, and issued a Letter of Review dated March 12, 2020 attached hereto as **Exhibit E**, commenting that the Applicant’s request for a waiver from Section 300-15.B from the minimum cartway width of 40 feet to 32 feet is consistent with the cartway width along Blair Mill Road; requested that roadway widening and drainage facilities be depicted on the Plan; and recommended Applicant install sidewalks and curbing along Blair Mill and Home Roads pursuant to Sections 300-18 and 300-19.A(1) of the Subdivision and Land Ordinance once development is proposed for the newly created Lot; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Upper Moreland Township Board of Commissioners that the Plan is hereby granted Conditional Preliminary/Final Subdivision Approval, subject to Applicants’ satisfaction of the following conditions:

1. Compliance with all comments as outlined in the Township Engineer’s Letter of Review dated April 1, 2020, set forth in **Exhibit B**.

2. Compliance with all comments as outlined in the Township Landscape Architect’s Letter of Review dated March 9, 2020, set forth in **Exhibit C**.

3. Compliance with all comments as outlined in the Township Traffic Engineer’s Letter of Review dated March 12, 2020, set forth in **Exhibit E**.

4. Further, the Board of Commissioners takes the following actions regarding the below waivers from the requirements of Chapter 300 of the Upper Moreland Township Code “Subdivision and Land Development,” requested by the Applicant, as noted in the Township Engineer’s Letter of Review dated April 1, 2020:

A. §300-15.B: from the requirement regarding the requirement to widen the cartway width of Blair Mill Road (S.R. 2026) to the required width of 20’, as the current cartway width is 13’ along the Property frontage and any widening along Blair Mill Road would require PennDOT approval.

B. §300-15.C: from the requirement to install road improvements (road widening and drainage facilities) along Blair Mill Road (S.R. 2026).

**Minutes**

A meeting of the APA was held on July 16, 2020 at 5:00 PM in the Upper Moreland Township building. Members present included Vice-Chairman Dan Barber, Dee Barnes, Ray Fox, George Hartman and Claire Warner from the MCPC. Not present: Jerry Foley, Denis Hurley & Arlene Rubin.

**Land Development**

**551 N. York Road.** Mike Yanoff, attorney for applicants, gave overview of proposed project. The development will be included with the Fairhill Commons student housing project. George Hartman commented it's important that the building facades along Fairhill Street be designed to "fit in" with the existing residences on the street. The Board members were in favor of the previous façade renderings presented to them during the Conditional Use process. Matt Genesisio, applicant, commented he did have his architect break up the roof lines and make other changes to the proposed buildings so they would present a more residential look. The Board reviewed the most recent renderings and commented that they had a much more residential look and feel.

Ray Fox questioned the wood slat structures along the front of buildings and the purpose. He also expressed concerns on the open breezeways/stairways as a possible noise issue for Fairhill Street residents.

Matt Genesisio said the structures were meant to break up the building façade and also offer a little more privacy for first floor residents. They will also take a look at the open stairways. The Board also questioned the length of leases and when the owners were expected to prepare the rooms for new students each year with cleaning, painting and other repairs.

Matt Genesisio said leases would be 10-12 months with 80% of leases being 10 months. The 12-month leases would actually be 11.5 months which would allow time for apartment maintenance. The proposed 4-story building would not be limited to students only as the owners did not want to run into issues in event no more students available. They don't see this being the case but they wanted this option rather than have units sit empty. This was explained and approved during the Conditional Use process.

Claire Warner discussed the MCPC 247 review, dated 6/26/20. It was recommended that the applicants enter into a formal agreement with the Upper Moreland Little League to allow overflow parking on their site during Little League season. The applicants will also be performing stormwater work, including rain gardens, on the Little League property.

**George Hartman made a motion to recommend approval of the land development application; seconded by Ray Fox. All in favor.**

**Subdivision**

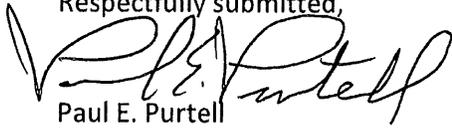
**4121 Blair Mill Road.** Project engineer, Nick Rose, was on hand to explain the proposed subdivision. Applicant wishes to sell the existing lot with home along with new lot for future construction of a single-family dwelling. Applicant is requesting waivers from the UMT subdivision/land development ordinance including sidewalks along Blair Mill Road and Home Road. He explained that there are not existing sidewalks adjacent to their site. There are also mature evergreen trees along Blair Mill Road which would require removal should sidewalks be installed. Photographs of existing features were also presented and discussed. Claire Warner discussed the MCPC 247 review, dated 2/27/20 and they are recommending installation of sidewalks in order to create a safer and more well-connected pedestrian network.

Additional discussion was held concerning the proposed subdivision and requested waivers. **Dan Barber made a motion to recommend approval of the proposed subdivision along with the sidewalk waiver request; seconded by George Hartman. All in favor.**

No further business.

Meeting adjourned at 5:45 PM.

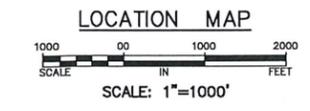
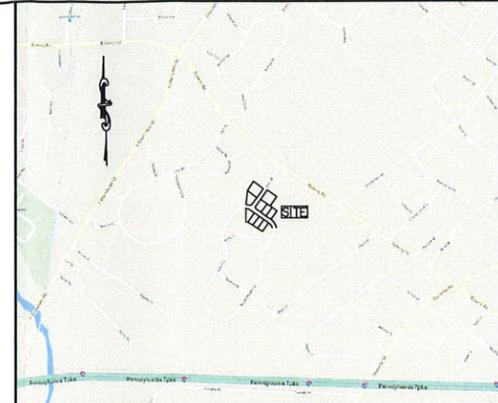
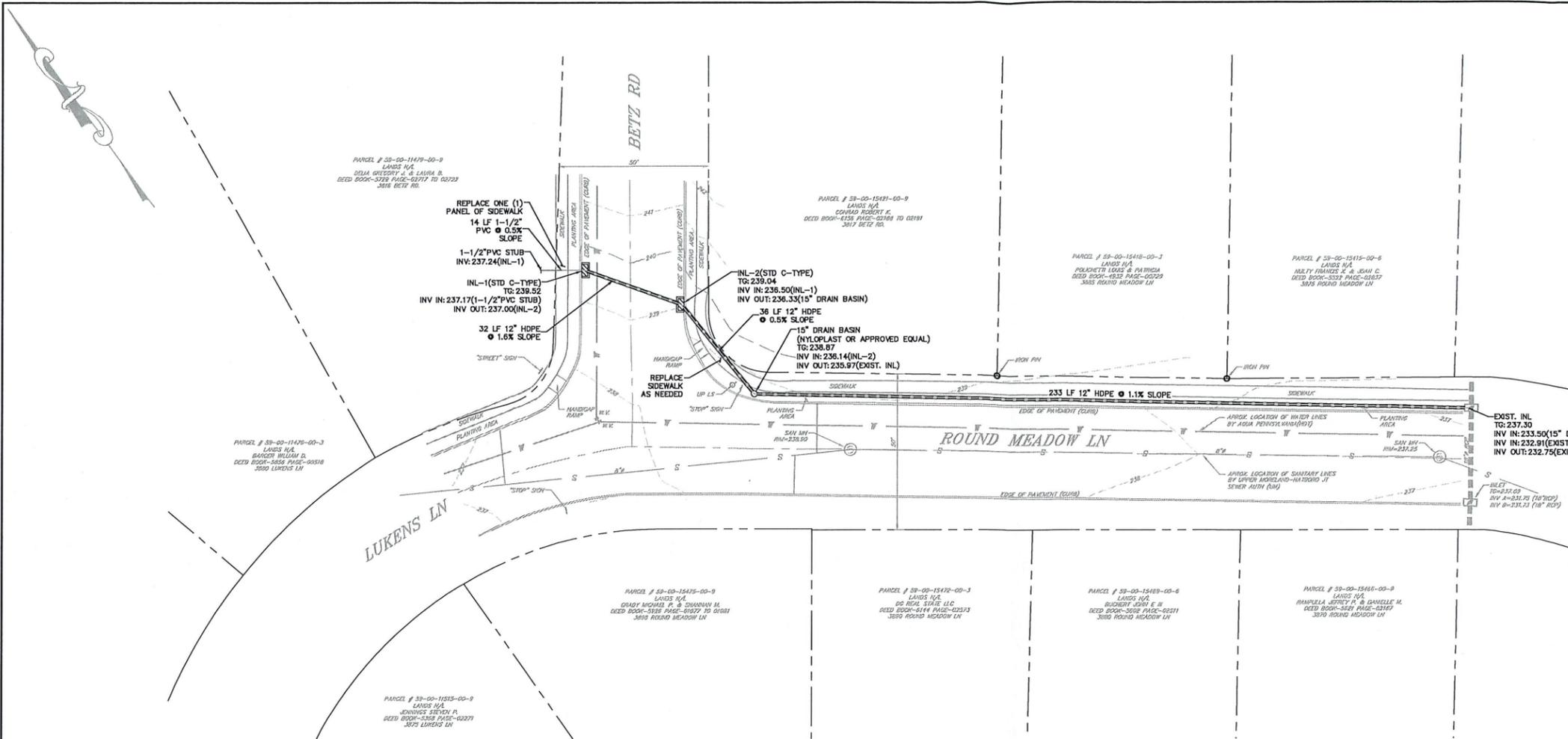

Alan,

Thanks for taking the time to meet the other day. There are two attachments to the email, one is that of an underground tank and the other is an above ground tank.



Per our conversation I believe the best way to get the gas into the house is to use the vent or filler line for the oil tank. Typically we'll install the tank, bring the underground line over, come above grade then back through one of those tubes. The plumber would take it from there to the heating system.

In regards to safety, maintenance and upkeep I believe that an underground is the way to go. They are cathodically protected which means it stays in the ground for arguably more than 30 years (our first underground installs were 1989) and those tanks are still good today. They do not require painting, less of an eye sore and become less of an attractive nuisance. Above ground tanks attract graffiti, people sitting on them, leaning things on them etc. An underground in this situation we could hide in the brush and would not take away from the beauty of the property. There is a cost difference but, I believe strongly the positives outweigh the cons and those come at an expense. Prices below are based on an installation including, excavation, labor and materials not including propane. All work is done by Penn Valley Gas with our employees and our equipment, nothing is sub contracted.

Above ground installation tank lease, n/c for the tank, billable part is installation and trenching \$1,000. Tank sale for the system is \$3,500.

Under ground installation tank lease, n/c for the tank, billable part is excavation, installation and trenching \$1,100 Tank sale for the system is \$5,087.

Current price per gallon a lease program using a minimum 700 gallons per year is \$1.65

If the annual use is under that amount it's currently \$1.85

If it drops below 500 gallons then it's \$2.20 and a tank rental would apply. At that point we'd recommend a tank purchase, all the fees go away and it's currently \$1.45 per gallon.

If market price changes up or down there is a consistent spread between those cost.

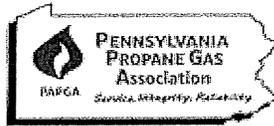
